Contestants Announced for the 2023 Cleveland International Piano Competition for Young Artists

32 Contestants will partake in unparalleled musical opportunities and pre-collegiate experiences designed to develop their artistry.

CLEVELAND, OH - February 7, 2023 Piano Cleveland announces the 32 contestants selected to compete for nearly \$30,000 in prizes at the 2023 Cleveland International Piano Competition for Young Artists. The organization received a record-breaking 213 applications of the highest performance level from 27 countries and regions. The Young Artists' journeys will culminate in Cleveland, where the six Finalists will perform chamber music live with members of The Cleveland Orchestra and concertos led by conductor Steven Byess with The Canton Symphony Orchestra, Gerhardt Zimmermann, Music Director. The performances will take place at Mixon Hall, Cleveland Institute of Music and Gartner Auditorium, Cleveland Museum of Art from July 11-16, 2023.

The 32 chosen contestants - hailing from nine countries and regions - were identified by members of the CIPC for Young Artists Screening Jury, which included Kathryn Brown (Head of the Piano Department and Keyboard Division, Cleveland Institute of Music), Emanuela Friscioni (Director of the Creative Arts Academy, Cuyahoga Community College), Spencer Myer (Associate Professor of Piano at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music), Paul Schenly (Founder/Director of Pianofest in the Hamptons and Artistic Director, Piano Cleveland) and Yaron Kohlberg (President, Piano Cleveland).

"The level of skill and artistry displayed by these contestants is remarkable and shows their great potential to thrive as the next generation of concert pianists," said Yaron Kohlberg, President of Piano Cleveland. "We are excited about our role in guiding them on their musical journey and providing experiences that will shape them into the dynamic artists of tomorrow."

These remarkable young artists will record their First Round solo recitals in six cities worldwide, including Cleveland, New York, London, Hamburg, Seoul, and Beijing. Recording venues have been selected in partnership with Steinway & Sons. Continuing their tradition of excellence in production, Piano Cleveland is working with the highest-level professionals to record First Round performances to ensure equity across all locations. The First Round will be broadcast on Amadeus.tv and Piano Cleveland's social platforms and website during the weekends of June 22-25 and June 29-July 2, 2023.

Following their First Round performances, six Finalists - three per age group - will be invited to Cleveland in July to participate in the Final Round live for Cleveland and global audiences. Finalists will perform at least three times while they are in Cleveland. First, each Finalist will play a free solo recital between July 5 - July 8 in three different locations, so audiences across Cleveland can experience the excellence of these developing pianists. Second, Finalists will play a Chamber Round performance with members of The Cleveland Orchestra on July 13 at Mixon Hall, Cleveland Institute of Music. And finally, the CIPC for Young Artists will culminate in the Concerto Round, where Finalists will play concerto movements with The Canton Symphony led by Maestro Steven Byess. Chamber and Concerto Round performances will be livestreamed.

The jury for the CIPC for Young Artists - who will be responsible for allocating almost \$30,000 in prizes - includes Ran Dank (University of Cincinnati - College Conservatory of Music), Kevin Kenner (Frost School of Music - University of Miami), Alexander Korsantia (New England Conservatory), Janet Landreth (International Keyboard Odyssiad & Festival), Vanessa Latarche (Royal College of Music), Yong Hi Moon (Peabody Institute at Johns Hopkins University) and Robert Shannon (Oberlin College & Conservatory).

In addition to their performances, Finalists will have the opportunity to work one-on-one with chamber music partners from The Cleveland Orchestra and Maestro Byess outside of rehearsal contexts, providing unique opportunities for these young artists to develop their craft and receive mentorship outside of the traditional youth competition structure.

Finalists will also be eligible to work with the exceptional faculty of the Cleveland International Piano Institute, a precollegiate intensive presented by Piano Cleveland and the Cleveland Institute of Music (CIM) that runs concurrently with the Final Round. From July 5 - 15, the Institute - held in partnership with the Lang Lang International Music Foundation will welcome 35 additional developing pianists to work with high-level faculty through lessons and masterclasses and take part in workshops that provide exceptional training beyond traditional topics, such as applying for higher music education and building a musical career. Institute participants and Finalists for the CIPC for Young Artists will learn alongside one another and have opportunities to meet and engage with local Cleveland piano students.
