WINNERS ANNOUNCED FOR THE 2023 CLEVELAND INTERNATIONAL PIANO COMPETITION FOR YOUNG ARTISTS

CLEVELAND, OH - JULY 16, 2023 The world's rising piano stars put on brilliant performances over the course of 12 days, culminating on Saturday evening at Gartner Auditorium with the Final Concerto Round performances. The winners of the 2023 Cleveland International Piano Competition for Young Artists (CIPC for Young Artists) were named at the award ceremony, directly following the performances with the Canton Symphony Orchestra, led by conductor Steven Byess.

The Finalists of the CIPC for Young Artists are among the most skilled individuals in their age group, gathering in Cleveland from countries around the globe. "These brilliant young artists brought passion, musical expertise, and personality to their performances," said Yaron Kohlberg, President of Piano Cleveland. "We are privileged and inspired to witness their extraordinary artistry on stage as they presented the next generation of classical music to audiences around the world."
